
Did you see Deacon Dwain Wright on Facebook as Hargray's Honoree for Black History Month? Congratulation's Dwain!

Free Shred Event - Tuesday, March 15 – USCB Hilton


SCDCA will partner with Shred360 to offer a free shred event from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., Tuesday, March 15 – University of South Carolina - Beaufort, 1 Sand Shark Drive, Hilton Head Island, SC 29928.

To shred your sensitive documents in a timely manner, the shred event is set up as a drive-through. Attendees are encouraged to stay in their vehicles and are limited to (3) three boxes (copy paper box or smaller) or (3) three bags (kitchen trash bag or smaller) per vehicle. There is no need to remove binder clips, paper clips, staples, rubber bands or CDs/DVDs prior to shredding.

NCPW is a time to help people understand their consumer rights and avoid frauds and scams. Follow SCDCA on <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Twitter</u> to receive tips throughout NCPW and learn ways to keep your personal identifying information safe.



Trying to figure out what to add to your yard this Spring?

Visit the Coastal Discovery Museum on March 19 for their annual Native Plant Sale!

The sale will take place in front of the Discovery Lab at the Coastal Discovery Museum Honey Horn grounds. Over 90 species of native plants will be available.



Native plants have great advantages, like requiring little care and providing great benefits to the local wildlife — plus helping you save water, energy and money. Town Approves Formation of Historic Stoney Neighborhood Economic Development Corporation

The creation of an economic development corporation approved by the Hilton Head Island Town Council will help foster and promote economic growth within the Island's historic Stoney neighborhood.

At its February 15th meeting, the Town Council passed a resolution authorizing Town Manager Marc Orlando to begin the preliminary process of forming the corporation that will

focus on promotion of cultural resources and protection of cultural assets, neighborhood sustainability, quality of life enhancements and entrepreneurialism. It will also focus on business attraction, expansion, and retention; land planning and development assistance; and providing financial opportunities.

"Creating this economic development corporation signals a commitment to action. This corporation is a step in the right direction because we can really help the community grow and thrive. I'm really excited about it," said Ward 1 Councilman Alex Brown, who represents the Stoney community.
